She spent her early teens reading every book of Agatha Christie's, and went on to work as critic and editor. She has spent several evenings on stage with Karl Ove Knausgård talking about his struggle and finally had the chance to confront John Irving in front of an audience some 18 years later. She is still waiting for the Swedish Academy to come to their senses and give the Nobel Prize to P.O. Enquist (after whom her two sons are named).


Ingrid Schibsted Jacobsen Agent, Crime & Commercial Fiction

DEBUT

Playful poems for anyone who wonders, thinks, dreams and occasionally gets beaten.

Christian Løchstøer debuts with playful, lively poems in rhyme, poems with stars and dust driven by reflection and philosophizing about life's puzzles, big and small. Existential questions are posed like: What do the stars do during the day? Who is the boy in the mirror, if he isn't me myself? And what's the story with mama walking around with a meat cleaver in the neighborhood at night? Many of the poems are replete with humor and nonsense, while others have a touch of something mournful. Here, we're on the same team as the boy who stares and stares at the pretty girl who doesn't notice him. Here is the corpse that sneaks out of its coffin and creeps around the garden, here are poems about writing, poems that jump across the paradise that lies between the stars, and thoughts that end in a thought cemetery.

Christian Løchstøer (b.1983) has written for television for several years, primarily within the humor genre. He is known as the third Ylvis and co-authored the enormous success hit *What does the fox say?* with the Ylvis brothers. This is his debut as an independent children's author.

Ea is 16 years old and sees herself as Miss Misfit. She's dropped out of school and fills her days with crocheting, writing her own autobiography, artistic projects – and eating.

And she hates everything that is Perfect.

"Why can't you be a bit more – normal?" asks her father. But Ea doesn't want to be normal

Her mother is terrified that her daughter will become mentally ill like Aunt Edith, who was an eccentric artist, enormously fat, quite insane and ended up taking her own life. So she sends Ea to therapy.

But Ea is so much more than a slightly overstuffed body. Perhaps she's actually the healthiest of them all?


