## Nora Dåsnes, author of the graphic novel Cross My Heart and Hope to Die

- 1. What kind of story is *Cross My Heart and Hope to Die?* Cross My Heart and Hope to Die is both a coming of age-story, and a coming out-story. It's written as a diary, and follows twelve year old Tuva through big and small dramas as she tries to navigate the space between being a child and a teenager.
- 2. What inspired you to write *Cross My Heart and Hope to Die*? Conversations with my childhood friends, reminiscing about how weird and wonderful it was to be a preteen girl. I started sketching out memories, feelings and characters, and the story grew from there.
- **3.** What time of the day is best for you as a writer? Mornings and late afternoons are usually best. I usually lose focus around midday and end up having really long lunch breaks.

- **4.** How long did it take you to write and illustrate *Cross My Heart and Hope to Die*? It took about a year from the first sketches, with a really intense drawing period of about three months.
- 5. What do you wish you had known before starting writing and drawing *Cross My Heart and Hope to Die?* I wish I knew how long the different stages would take, just to make planning a little easier. I'd never done a project with so many drawings before, so I really didn't know what I was getting myself into, especially because it ended up being about a hundred pages longer than I'd imagined!
- **6.** What do you like best: writing or drawing? Both! To make up stories with both words and pictures feels the most natural to me.
- **7.** What do you think makes a good story? Conflict. Ideally conflict that isn't just good versus evil, but where both sides have a good reason.
- **8.** What do you like to do when you're not writing? I love going for long walks around Oslo, throw dinner parties, go to concerts and travel by train. These days I have taken up both knitting and sourdough baking as "quarantine-hobbies".
- **9.** As a child, what did you want to do when you grew up? A marine biologist. I was really obsessed with sharks!
- **10.** Who are your favorite author and favorite book? It's so hard to choose, but I think Tove Jansson might be my favourite author overall and John Steinbeck's *Grapes of Wrath* my favourite book.
