For her illustrations in the bestselling *The Girl Book* and *The Boy Book*, written by Nina Brochmann and Ellen Støkken Dahl, she was awarded "GOLD" and "SILVER" for best illustrations and design the Year's Most Beautiful Books (the Norwegian Designer's Guild's Visual Prize). Winsnes has worked with several animation productions as animator, designer, director and producer. Among them the Academy Award winner animation film, "The Danish Poet", directed by Torill Kove.

When her best friend Benji becomes a suspect for a mysterious theft, she is forced to make an impossible choice: the dance group or Benji?
