Many children want a pet. The animals we call pets don't really come from the pet shop. They come from high mountains, the desert, the steppes, the sea and the rainforest. It's fun to have a pet! You get a good animal friend and memories for life. But there's also a lot to think about. Do you want to change drinking water, pick up poop and make sure your pet doesn't get bored? Not just for a few weeks, but for many years? And do you know what kind of equipment you really need to keep a cat, a rabbit, a dog or a budgie?
